
Brother Treasurer Swen Ekstrom Awarded Mason of the Month



At our Second Stated meeting on February 15th, Andrea Knies, Director of Communications and Community Engagement, and Jodi Carroll, Special Project Manager, of Realize Bradenton visited Manatee 31 for an informative and spirited presentation on the Riverwalk Expansion and the future of historic Manatee Village. Realize Bradenton engages people to make a positive impact and promote Bradenton.



One project that was shared by Jodi and Andrea was the recent publication of "Old Manatee from A to Z." This primer of Manatee history was a Realize Bradenton project with 26 well researched facts dating back to the 1800's.

Ryan G. Van Cleave, Sarasota author and head of the creative writing pro-Art and Design and Don Brandes, illustrator and Ringling college professor brought the project to fruition with sublime text and illustrations. W:. Anthony DiMauro was gifted with a copy of this first children's book on Bradenton and its companion coloring book.


Jodi and Andrea also told the Craft and guests about the recent Reflections of Manatee Mineral Springs archeological dig. The findings are just now being revealed by Dr. Uzi Baram, professor of anthropology and the director of New College's Archaeology Lab. The Mineral Springs property had been home to Maroons. former Africans slaves, prior to Josiah Gates coming to the shores of the Manatee. The importance of the archeological findings cannot be underscored as we move closer to Phase 2 of the Riverwalk Expansion.

The Riverwalk Expansion is due to start "soon" according to Jodi and Angram at Ringling College of drea. They talked at length on how community engagement drove the decision-making process and shared the design plans of the architectural firm Kimley Horn. Designated as passive space, the Riverwalk Expansion will include a pier, kayak launch, pavilion, and public art. The project will be completed in phases with the Mineral Spring phase launching the project as soon as this fall.

> Not everyone was happy with the Riverwalk Expansion process and decisions as, no doubt, this most historic area of Manatee County will forever be changed. Despite the unfortunate determination that leaves the Gates-Glazier property landlocked, the evening's presentation made clear the importance of partnerships as this project moves forward.


In Honor of President's Day

Until 1971, both February 12th and February 22nd were observed as federal holidays to honor the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and George Washington, respectively. Presidents' Day, one single federal holiday to be observed on the third Monday of February, was proclaimed by President Richard Nixon in 1971 to honor all past presidents.

While the Masonic affiliation of Brother George Washington is well known, thirteen other Presidents have also been Masons. These 14 presidents span the history of the United States from George Washington to Gerald Ford. February and Presidents' Day offers Masons the opportunity to recognize the contributions of these Brothers to our country.

George Washington 1732-1799

Initiated on November 4, 1752 in Fredericksburg Lodge No. 4, Fredericksburg, Virginia. Elected Worshipful Master on December 20, 1788. Brother Washington was raised to Master Mason at the age of 20 in 1753. He became Worshipful Master on December 20, 1788, and was inaugurated President of the United States on April 30, 1789, thus becoming the first, and so far the only Brother to be simultaneously President and Master of his Lodge.



James Monroe


1758-1831

Initiated on November 9, 1775 in Williamsburg Lodge No. 6, Williamsburg, Virginia at the age of 17 while he studied at the College of William & Mary. Monroe was not yet eighteen, but "lawful age" had not yet been universally fixed at twenty-one.

Andrew Jackson

1767-1845

(Lodge records lost) The record for Brother Jackson has not been located. He seems to have been a Member of St. Tammany Lodge No. 1, Nashville, Tennessee, as early as 1800. It was the first Lodge in Tennessee, organized in 1789, under a Dispensation from the Grand Lodge of North Carolina. The name was later changed to Harmony Lodge No. 1 on November 1, 1800. Brother Jackson is officially listed as a Member in the Lodge Return to the Grand Lodge of North Carolina and Tennessee for 1805. On December 27, 1813, the Grand Lodge of Tennessee was granted its own Constitution. Brother Jackson was the sixth Grand Master of Masons of Tennessee, serving from October 7, 1822 until October 4, 1824.



In Honor of President's Day

James K. Polk

1795-1849

Initiated on June 5, 1820, Columbia Lodge No. 31, Columbia, Tennessee. Brother Polk assisted in the Cornerstone Laying of the Smithsonian Institution, Washington, D.C., May 1, 1847.

James Buchanan

1791-1868

Initiated on December 11, 1816 in Lodge No. 43, Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Brother Buchanan became Worshipful Master of Lodge No. 43 1822-1823; and in 1824 was appointed District Deputy Grand Master for the Counties of Lancaster, Lebanon and York.

Andrew Johnson

1808-1875

Initiated on May 5, 1851 in Greenville Lodge No. 119, Greenville, Tennessee.

James A. Garfield

1831-1881

Initiated on November 19, 1861 in Magnolia Lodge No. 20, Columbus, Ohio and raised on November 22, 1864 in Columbus Lodge No. 30. Joined Garrettsville Lodge No. 246, Garrettsville, Ohio in 1866 and was its Chaplain for the years 1868-69. Charter Member of Pentalpha Lodge No. 23, Washington, D.C.

William McKinley

1843-1901

Initiated on May 1, 1865 in Hiram Lodge No. 21, Winchester, Virginia. Joined Canton Lodge No. 60, Canton, Ohio in 1867. Charter member of Eagle, later William McKinley, Lodge No. 431, also in Canton.



In Honor of President's Day

Theodore Roosevelt 1858-1919

Initiated on January 2, 1901, Matinecock Lodge No. 806, Oyster Bay, New York. Brother and President Roosevelt visited the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania (in its present home, the Masonic Temple at One North Broad Street) on November 5, 1902, for the Celebration of the Sesqui-Centennial of Brother George Washington's Initiation into Freemasonry. Governor of New York, 1899-1901. Brother and President Roosevelt issued an Executive Order, dated October 17, 1901 changing the name of the "Executive Mansion" to the "White House".



William H. Taft

1857-1930

Initiated on February 18, 1909. Brother Taft was made a "Mason at Sight" within the Body of Kilwinning Lodge No. 356, Cincinnati, Ohio, by Grand Master Charles S. Hoskinson. His father and two brothers were also Members of this Lodge. Brother and President Taft addressed the Brethren, saying, "I am glad to be here, and to be a Mason. It does me good to feel the thrill that comes from recognizing on all hands the Fatherhood of God and the Brotherhood of Man." Brother and President Taft visited the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania on the occasion of a Special Communication held in the Masonic Temple, One North Broad Street, on March 12, 1912.



Warren G. Harding

1865-1923

Initiated on June 28, 1901, Marion Lodge No. 70, Marion, Ohio. Because of some personal antagonism, Brother Harding's advancement was hindered until 1920, by which time he had been nominated for President. Friends persuaded the opposition to withdraw the objection, and on August 27, 1920, nineteen years after his Initiation, Brother Harding achieved the Sublime Degree of Master Mason, in Marion Lodge. At his request, Brother Harding took the Oath of Office of President of the United States upon the same Bible as was used by Brother George Washington for the same purpose on April 30, 1789, the Altar Bible of St. John's Lodge No. 1, New York City.

In Honor of President's Day

Franklin D. Roosevelt 1882-1945

Initiated on October 11, 1911, Holland Lodge No. 8, New York City. Brother Roosevelt participated in the Raising of his son Elliott (1910-1990) on February 17. 1933, in Architect's Lodge No. 519, also in New York City. He was present, but did not participate in the Degrees when two other sons, James (1907-1991) and Franklin



D., Jr. (1914-1988) became Members of their brother Elliott's Lodge, on November 7, 1935. Brother and President Roosevelt was made the first Honorary Grand Master of the Order of DeMolay on April 13, 1934 at the White House. Brother Roosevelt was a cousin of former president and Master Mason, Theodore Roosevelt. Governor of New York, 1929-1933.

Harry S. Truman

1884-1972

Initiated on February 9, 1909, Belton Lodge No. 450, Belton, Missouri. In 1911, several Members of Belton Lodge separated to establish Grandview Lodge No. 618, Grandview, Missouri, and Brother Truman served as its first Worshipful Master. At the Annual Session of the Grand Lodge of Missouri, September 24-25, 1940, Brother Truman was elected, by a landslide, the ninetyseventh Grand Master of Masons of Missouri, and served until October 1, 1941. Brother and President Truman was made a Sovereign Grand Inspector General, 33°, and Honorary Member, Supreme Council on October 19, 1945 at the Supreme Council A.A.S.R. Southern Jurisdiction



Headquarters in Washington D.C., upon which occasion he served as Exemplar (Representative) for his Class. He was also elected an Honorary Grand Master of the International Supreme Council, Order of DeMolay. On May 18, 1959, Brother and Former President Truman was presented with a fifty-year award, the only U.S. President to reach that golden anniversary in Freemasonry.

Gerald Ford

1913-2006

Initiated on September 30, 1949, Malta Lodge No. 465, Grand Rapids, Michigan, along with his half-brothers Thomas Gardner Ford (1918-1995), Richard Addison Ford (1924-) and James Francis Ford (1927-). The Fellowcraft and Master Mason Degrees were Conferred by Columbia Lodge No. 3, Washington, D.C., on April 20 and May 18, 1951, as a courtesy to Malta Lodge. Brother Ford was made a Sovereign Grand Inspector General, 33°, and Honorary Member, Supreme Council A.A.S.R. Northern Jurisdiction at the Academy of Music in Philadelphia, on September 26, 1962, for which he served as Exemplar (Representative) for his Class. Brother and President Ford was unanimously elected an Active Member of the International Supreme Council, Order of DeMolay and its Honorary Grand Master, at its Annual Session held at



Orlando, Florida, April 6-9, 1975; Brother Ford held this post until January 1977, at which time he became a Past Honorary Grand Master, receiving his Collar and Jewel on October 24, 1978 in Topeka, Kansas, from the Hon. Thomas C. Raum, Jr., Grand Master, Order of DeMolay.


